CURE RESEARCH FUNDING:

CLF provides leukemia/lymphoma research funding annually to Michigan's two NCI-designated Comprehensive Cancer Centers, Barbara Ann Karmanos Cancer Institute and University of Michigan Comprehensive Cancer Center.
